Cambridge Australia Allen Scholarship Cambridge Australia Bragg Scholarship Cambridge Australia McCrum Scholarship	PhD	<p>David Charles Keith Allen AO has endowed one, three year scholarship to be awarded each year. Applicants for this scholarship should include Corpus Christi or “Open Application” as one of their two choices in their University application. The name of the scholarship, (<i>Allen/ Bragg/ McCrum</i>) recycles every 3 years.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Charles Allen AO, a Corpus Christi College graduate in 1959, worked for Shell International in oil exploration and production around the world until posted to Australia in 1979 as CEO of Woodside Petroleum Ltd. On retirement after 16 years with WPL he served as Chairman or director on several boards including CSIRO, NAB, Air Liquide (Australia), Amcor and the Florey Institute of Neuroscience and Mental Health. 2. William Henry Bragg, OM,KBE,FRS, Nobel Prize (1915 for Physics) was a physicist, chemist, mathematician and active sportsman. His son, William Lawrence Bragg, CH,KBE,MC,FRS, Nobel Prize (1915 for Physics) was an Australian-born physicist and x-ray crystallographer and discoverer of the Bragg law of X-ray diffraction. He was joint winner with his father of the Nobel Prize for Physics in 1915. Lawrence was also the director of the Cavendish Laboratory when the discovery of the structure of DNA was made by Watson and Crick in February 1953. The mineral Braggite is named after Bragg Senior and Bragg Junior. 3. Michael William McCrum CBE was Head Master of Eton College, Master of Corpus Christi College and Vice-Chancellor of the University of Cambridge.
Cambridge Australia Caius Scholarship	PhD	Funded by donations from Gonville & Caius College alumni and other interested persons. Available only to scholars accepted by Gonville & Caius College.
Cambridge Australia Fisher Scholarship	PhD	Funded by donation from Professor Henry Bennett in memory of Sir Ronald Aylmer Fisher, an English statistician, evolutionary biologist, eugenicist and geneticist, who spent some time as a senior research fellow at the CSIRO in Adelaide. Awarded to one scholar at a time (i.e. approximately every 3 years as accumulated funds permit).

Cambridge Australia Fulton Scholarship	PhD	Funded by a bequest from the late Miss Kathleen Clarice Hammer and named in honour and memory of the late Miss Barbara Rosalind Fulton. Barbara Rosalind Fulton, born in Tasmania in 1899, was educated at the University of Sydney in the early 1920's and undertook further studies at the University of Cambridge, 1934-35. She served with the YWCA War Service in the Middle East, 1942-43 and spent many years before and after the war working in India. After returning to Australia she taught at various private girls' schools in Sydney. Awarded to one scholar at a time (i.e. approximately every 6 years as accumulated funds permit).
Cambridge Australia Kater Scholarship	PhD	Funded by a donation from Lady Catherine Kater in memory of Sir Gregory Blaxland Kater (1912-1978), businessman and army officer. Awarded to one scholar at a time (i.e. approximately every 6 years as accumulated funds permit).
Cambridge Australia Newnham Scholarship	PhD	Funded by donation from Professor Jan Anderson, international expert on photosynthesis research. She has been an Adjunct Professor at the Research School of Biological Sciences at the Australian National University since 1996 and was Chief Research Scientist at CSIRO's Division of Plant Industry. Will be awarded to one scholar at a time (i.e. approximately every 3 years as accumulated funds permit). Available only to female scholars accepted by Newnham College.
Cambridge Australia Oliphant Scholarship	PhD	Funded by donation from Professor Peter and Dr Barbara Treacy in memory of Sir Mark Oliphant, former Governor of South Australia and Australian physicist and humanitarian. Awarded to one scholar at a time (i.e. approximately every 3 years as accumulated funds permit).
Cambridge Australia Poynton Scholarship	PhD	Funded by major bequest from Dr Orde Poynton who was born in 1906 in England and studied at the University of Cambridge (Gonville and Caius College) where he trained as a medical doctor. During the Second World War he became a prisoner of war in Changi Prison. After the war, he moved to Australia and was a Lecturer at the University Medical School as well as the Director of the Institute of Veterinary and Medical Science. Following his retirement in 1961, he became a consulting bibliographer to the University of Melbourne. Awarded annually. The number of scholarships depends on state of accumulated funds and availability of suitable candidates.
Cambridge Australia WongCalthorpe Scholarship	PhD	Funded by donation from Dr George H C Wong and Dr C Mary Calthorpe. Applicants for these scholarships should include Sidney Sussex as one of their two choices of College or "open application" in their University application. Awarded to one scholar at a time (i.e. approximately every 3 years as accumulated funds permit).
Cambridge Australia 800th Anniversary Scholarship	PhD	Funded by donations from Australian Cambridge alumni and from accumulated CAS funds. Awarded to one scholar at a time (i.e. approximately every 3 years as accumulated funds permit).

Masters named Scholarships (alphabetical)

Cambridge Australia Allen Scholarship	Masters	Funded by donation from David Charles Keith Allen AO, two half scholarships (VIC) are offered annually for a one-year Masters degree. Applicants for these scholarships should include Corpus Christi as one of their two choices of College or “open application” in their University application.
Cambridge Australia Frank Downing Scholarship	Masters	Award established by Christopher K G Rowe and the Downing Family in honour of Frank Downing QC, who was for many years the leader of the commercial bar in WA. Candidates must be either born in WA or have taken a degree from a WA university. Preference given to candidates wishing to study Law.
Patrick Moore Cambridge Australia Scholarship	Masters	Funded by donation from Patrick Moore, up to two half scholarships (VIC) are offered annually for a one-year Masters degree.
Davis McCaughey Cambridge Australia Scholarship	Masters	Funded by Australian alumni of Pembroke College in honour and memory of John Davis McCaughey AC, a Bible scholar, Christian minister, university administrator and the Governor of Victoria from 1986 to 1992. This scholarship, currently awarded for Masters degree studies, may also be awarded for PhD studies at the discretion of CAS and the McCaughey donors to candidates who have been accepted by Pembroke College.
Cambridge Australia Erich Narev Scholarship	Masters	Funded by a donation from Ian Narev and Frances Allan this is a full scholarship (NSW) for a one-year Masters degree. Awarded in preference to candidates wishing to study mathematics, a science or human rights. Consideration given to candidates where some kind of disadvantage (past or present) exists.
Cambridge Australia A P Platt Scholarship	Masters	Funded by a donation from Jeremy Platt in honour of his Father, Dr Alan Percy Platt, for up to two half scholarships annually for a one-year Masters degree. Dr Alan Percy Platt studied biochemistry at Liverpool University graduating with a First in BSc Hons in July 1936 and a PhD in 1938. He conducted research at Liverpool with among others, Rodney Porter, joint Nobel Laureate in Medicine in 1972. Alan worked with Lord Woolton in the Ministry of Food during the war and then got a job as Scientific Manager of the research department of Quaker Oats in 1944. He died suddenly in March in 1945.

Charlie Perkins Scholarship	Masters	Cambridge Australia Scholarships and the Cambridge Commonwealth, European and International Trust have an agreement with The Charlie Perkins Trust dated 18 November 2010. Roberta Sykes Scholarship	Masters	Cambridge Australia Scholarships and the Cambridge Commonwealth, European and International Trust have an agreement with The Roberta Sykes Education Foundation dated 31 May 2013. Under this agreement CAS co-contributes to a full Masters scholarship awarded to outstanding indigenous Australian scholars.
